
PMWB : Current Projects ...

- Habitat for Humanity (providing PM skills for nascent nonprofit organizations, formulating a charter in a grant application context)
- SCL Health (bringing healing, health and lots of supplies to eastern Africa)
















Ghana Elevation Map





Why does PMWB want to step in and help ...

- This project matters to me because of some of the personal stories that I heard in Accra. People at the conference were personally involved at the recent floods.
- PMI Ghana has been thinking about it, but they do not have the necessary expertise, connections, and global reach.

PMWB together with PMI Ghana decided to provide to the ACCRA authorities :

expert advise from International and renown PM's and engineers, on the recurrent flooding's in the city, translated into a MASTER ACTION PLAN involving all stakeholders, describing individual tasks for each.

Output of the GHANA Workshop :

- Stakeholder Inventory
- Stakeholder Analysis
- Identified missing but essential Stakeholders
- Allowed us to produce :
- "Protocol of Understanding & Collaboration"
- Issued to more then 50 identified stakeholders, ministries, agencies ...
- Currently collection feedback, and issuing a monthly "Domain" proposal

Typical workshop topics

- 1. Plan complex and disparate stakeholder management in a government environment
- 2. Handling of surface water in a region prone to flooding
- 3. Solutions for rapidly implementing an effective waste collection system
- 4. How to get buy-in from a local population for a new waste collection system
- 5. Diverting waterways and surface waters around a capital city / Creation of sub-terrain sinks or holding areas to temporarily absorb excess of wateer before it hits densely populated area's
