"Action learning is an approach to solving real problems that involves taking action and reflecting upon the results, which helps improve the problem-solving process, as well as the solutions developed by the team." (Wikipedia) This seminar presents a methodology and cases where action learning in teams, and specifically appointed "change leaders", have been used to create large scale change in service organizations. Two examples are a major pharmacy chain that increased productivity by 10 %, and a hotel chain that accomplished major energy savings with very limited investment in new technology. These projects demonstrate that once employees are engaged in a meaningful way, major business results can be accomplished by boosting employee creativity and engagement. Organizations are either doing business as usual (BAU) or running projects. In most cases, organizations are governed by functional divisions called 'silos' and use a hierarchical management approach to do their business.

Push management, waste, context switching and multitasking are present everywhere. ORGANIZATIONAL AGILITY AND ITS IMPACT ON PROJECTS – 3 CASE STUDIES

Businesses are grappling with unprecedented levels of adverse, unexpected change that creates a chaotic environment in which it is difficult to initiate/execute projects. A high degree of agility can help an organization better react to unexpected change offsetting its impact to new or inflight projects. This presentation examines three different strategies used in initiating/executing projects in agile organizations: • Roald Amundsen's expedition, search of the Northwest-Passage (1903-1906), did not have the constraints of a large, rigid, zierarchical organization like the British Royal-Navy. So agility was at the core of his approach, down to selecting the right type of sailing craft. • Charles Lindbergh (1927), a last entry to the transatlantic flight race, had to respond with great agility, and short-circuited the build-project of his aircraft by coming up with a strategy to beat far better equipped and resourced competitors and win the Orteig-Prize. • General Patton's rescue of the town Bastogne (1944) was thought impossible by Allied command who had written off the U.S. 101st Airborne Division.

THE AGILE PMO – PRACTICAL VALUE DRIVEN CHANGE LEADERSHIP IN PROJECTS AND PORTFOLIOS

The Agile PMO – Practical Value Driven Change Leadership

Approximately 50 percent of Project Management Offices (PMO) are terminated in 2 years. Yet, we repeat the same mistakes in our implementations! We use generic project control processes to stifle project and product delivery; focusing on cost, time, and scope, rather than leading our projects to deliver value. In this presentation we discuss an alternative model for a value driven PMO, as an integrator, enabler, differentiator, and change agent, in business development and the organization. FOSTER INTERNATIONAL COLLABORATION AND SUSTAINABILITY SOLUTIONS - LESSONS LEARNED FROM INTERNATIONAL HIGH-SPEED RAIL PROJECT

High Speed Rail Technology is globalized, but it is not unique and must be adapted to the country it is being built in. Two Authority and Program teams, one in California and one in Sweden, are responsible for the next step in their countries transport history: introducing sustainable High Speed Rail to the transport system. During an international transfer from Sweden to California, knowledge was shared and bridges of collaboration were built between the two countries and teams. This is a story about the lessons learned. Transportation development and project management is in many ways facing the same challenges around the world. The largest differences are a result of our history, demography and geography. By using agile methods for collaboration, knowledge and experiences can be shared efficiently. With respect to dissimilarities, the two teams can share top class knowledge about technical features, how to make a rail system attractive, and approaches to maximizing reduction of greenhouse gas emissions.

Program management offers a unique advantage for information technology projects, where interdependencies present significant technical as well as management challenges. Most discussions of program management focus just on the management dimensions (cost, schedule, risk, quality). For IT programs, however, the technical dimensions are also critical and often have management consequences as well. This presentation shows how program management can enable effective integration through management of both technical considerations — architecture, interfaces, requirements, testing — and traditional considerations. One of the biggest challenges that program management can help IT projects overcome is the basic tendency to minimize external dependencies, which might be a good approach for a stand-alone capability, but which can fundamentally undermine the value of an IT project. It also offers a model for PMOs that need to address both management and technical program support needs, particularly in a world where Agile delivery is becoming the norm for most IT projects.

MANAGING CRITICAL DECISIONS - A KEY TO SUCCESSFUL PROJECT EXECUTION

It has been shown that delays, rework and missed targets in projects are frequently linked to lack of decision-making awareness and capabilities. The aim is to present a defined decision-making process allowing project managers to enhance the decision quality, resulting in a higher likelihood to deliver the project in line with plans and reaching goals/objectives. Furthermore, this increases the flexibility, as decisions are planned upfront and options are evaluated in a structured manner. This work focuses on complex decisions which don't have easily calculated and simple solutions. Engineering organizations often use a rational approach for decisions, based on well-defined objectives, closed decision-making processes, optimization towards a firm target with all required information, etc. In practice, we face a bounded rational reality, with achievable (might change) objectives and aim for "good enough" solutions, based on limited information and inconsistency, in which decisions are based on judgement with an open decision-making process.



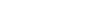



PASSION FOR AGILITY WITH TOM BJÖRKHOLM

Hello, who are you?

Hello, I am an ordinary guy with an engineering background. I have been involved in software development both as a project manager and as a programmer for more than 20 years. My work has been mainly in the fields of telecom, embedded software and industrial robots. My early ad-hoc approach to project management got more structured with the PROPS model at Ericsson in 1997. In the late 1990s I observed how many project managers got obsessed with the project documents and forgot about the product that the project was supposed to produce. This got me interested in what was then called light weight project processes (these ideas were later extended and rebranded as Agile).

Since then I have lead both waterfall and Agile projects. Sometimes the sponsor has demanded strict waterfall, but not always. My personal preference is to keep the project as Agile and with a process as light weight as possible. I like to focus on the benefits the project should produce, while making sure that the project is enhancing and not destroying the organisation that hosts the project (i.e. relations to customers, team competence and satisfaction, quality of code base left to successors, stakeholder trust, etc.)

You are one of our most frequent organizer of local events within agile. What kind of events have PMI Sweden Chapter organised within agile the last years?

During the last year we have organised a number of local Agile events in Stockholm. Most have been seminars with an invited Agile guru from outside PMI: "Agile and Kanban" (Tomas Björkholm), "Coaching Agile Teams" (Mattias Skarin), "Flow" (Andrew Kallman), "Scrum at Nordnet Bank" (Anna Persson), "Agile Contracts" (Mattias Skarin), "Specification by Example" (Gojko Adzic), "The Successful Agile Transformation" (Morgan Ahlström) and "Developing Your Organization's Agile Coaching Capability" (Lyssa Adkins). For these we have had a large audience with a mix of PMI members and nonmembers.

We did also experiment with a workshop on Scrum in June.

The biggest new idea (this far) for the program in 2018 is a study group on how to scale Agile. There are four evenings, each dedicated to one framework: Nexus, LeSS, SAFe and the Spotify Model. The participants must commit to the complete series, and cannot come only individual evenings. The number of participants is kept low (15). By this we hope to both enhance the Agile competence and to create a group that will bond to a team. The interest for this

study group has been great, and we even have a participant from Gothenburg travelling to Stockholm for every evening.

What are your reflections and thoughts on organisational agility?

Today Agile is something of a buzzword. Most companies want to claim to be Agile, some without even knowing what it means. The biggest challenge is to move from paying lip-service to Agile, to really implementing Agile and to run the company and its projects in an Agile way.

How do you see PMIs role in the agile community?

Today there is unfortunately a confidence gap and a lot of distrust between some agile practitioners and some non-agile practitioners. Here PMI can really make a difference by bridging this gap and by building trust. When PMI is demonstrating its interest in Agile practices, the agile practitioners see that an organisation they viewed as very non-agile is actually "a good guy" that wants to learn Agile.

To the non-agile practitioners PMI is an organisation with a lot of credibility. The fact that PMI shows interest in Agile will probably help the non-agile practitioners to see Agile as something less dangerous and more credible.


